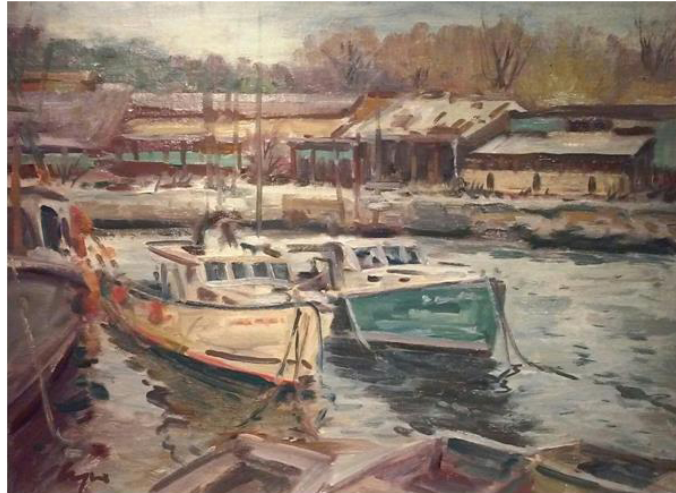

Chris Coyne is a plein air and studio painter from Rockport Mass. He paints landscapes and the occasional still life or portrait in both oils and watercolors. Dog portraits are a specialty.

Chris paints in the impressionist manner of the Cape Ann School, using Grùppe's nine color palette. He shows his art at various venues and entertains clients and students at his home studio in Rockport, MA. He dedicates his life and teaching to the pursuit of the art spirit and lifestyle.

Chris can be reached by phone at 203-543-1562 to set up an appointment or lesson.

The goal of this workshop is to make students feel more comfortable painting their environs whether in the studio or working plein air. Chris will introduce them to his techniques of working quickly to capture a scene.

After an introduction and a review of his materials, Chris will do a demonstration of a scene in the morning and in the afternoon. Students will be encouraged to paint along. Each study will take approximately two hours. There will be a critique at lunchtime to review the morning work and one at the end of the day.

Chris will create at least one 12" x 16" painting and possibly one larger piece. Students should bring at least two primed canvases. Bring more if you wish to work on 6" x 8" or 8" x 10" canvases.

This instructor encourages a friendly, low key environment. **Please pack your enthusiasm!**

1. Oil
2. Acrylic
3. Water Media (under glass)
4. Photography
5. Pastel/Charcoal/Collage/Mixed Media/Calligraphy/Drawing

Artwork Requirements: Work must be original (no copies or use of copyrighted work), and not previously exhibited at any FAA shows. Framed artwork maximum width is 24", and height of 36". Entries must be properly framed (no clip-on frames, saw-tooth hooks, fish-line) wire only - ready for hanging. Frames, glass, mats must be not dirty, chipped, damaged, and no wet paint. Work NOT meeting these guidelines will be rejected at check in.

Commission: All work sold will be subject to 20% commission.

Bin Work for November 5th Opening ONLY: Bin can be solo or shared. Bin art must be unframed, in clear envelopes, and all bin/small works must be clearly priced, with artist name. Bins and bin work must be dropped off at 3pm on reception date, and taken down at the end of the reception.

Exhibit & Reception: Please bring finger food, snacks, bottled water, soft drinks, coffee/tea, (with set ups for same), for food table. Sign up for donating food can be made at FAA October or November monthly meetings.

Awards: Exhibit will not be judged exhibit. There will be a "Peoples Choice" award. (People's Choice award voted on by show attendees). The award will be announced at the Holiday Party.

Labels: Please print labels. Your correct information is needed for exhibit viewing booklet/program.

Send **lower group** of labels, and signed waiver. Attach **top group** of labels to back of your artwork. (Category on previous page.)
